**MAYOR BATHURST** – Number of items for council; One of the items would be that today over the Drexelbrook there was a luncheon honoring those that were over a hundred and there were ninety persons in Delaware County that are one hundred plus and they were fortunate at the luncheon to have thirty-five of them in attendance and one of the attendants was a resident of Glenolden, a gentleman over on Gardner Avenue and we are going to give him a certificate of recognition to Mr. Harry Greim A long time resident in recognition of his 100<sup>th</sup> birthday and there’s congratulations here on reaching this outstanding milestone and is given by Council this twelfth day of May.

**President Danzi** – Please congratulate Mr. Greim for all of us.

**Mayor Bathurst** – The other person that would be recognizable from Glenolden is Ellen Linville, she is presently a resident in Elizabethtown. She turned 100 on May 4<sup>th</sup>. She also received one of these at a family affair. In May, the VFW post down in Norwood has a loyalty day program and in recognition of the loyalty day, the Police Department and the Glenolden Fire Department were both recognized for their contributions to the community and along with that Barry Harris was given the Patriots Pin award for an essay that he wrote about Patriotism representing Interboro High School and I believe these essays are now sent to the state level. Also, last week both Corporal Gensemer and Corporal Helms attended the Delaware County Law Enforcement Memorial Service. There was a mass down at Saint Catherine Drexel in Chester and from there they went in procession to Rose Tree Park where the Police Memorial is and part of the ceremony is that the Officers carry hats representing the deceased members of the Police Department and here from Glenolden, the Officers carried for Bob Sparks and for Chief McGovern from back I believe in the thirties, so they participated in that. The Corporals have completed their year of probation on April 15<sup>th</sup> son therefore having completed their one year probationary period they would become permanent Corporals. I think that’s all the notes I have except the Memorial Day Parade is Monday, May 25<sup>th</sup>, going from the Legion Post to the main entrance to Glenolden Park and on Sunday they will also be doing a memorial service at the Knowles Cemetery honoring the veterans that are buried up there from present all the way back to Civil War are buried up there. That is all I have.

**Mr. Hoover** – There were four bids received for the 2009 Road Program, I’ll read the Base bid and the Alternate bid together. First was Innovative construction with a base bid of \$241,283.50, the alternate bid of \$189,059.00 for a total bid of \$430,342.50; AF Damon with a base bid of \$262,238.50, the alternate bid of \$197,667.00 for a total bid of \$459,905.50; Kehoe Construction with a base bid of \$270,511.50, the alternate bid of 226,463.00 for a total bid of \$496,974.50; and JFC Contractors with a base bid of \$340,777.50, the alternate bid of \$301,497.50 for a total bid of \$642,275.00. That’s all of the bids.
